on Suffering and Adversity

“We would like to ignore suffering, hide it, and pretend it is not there, but reality forces us to face it in spite of ourselves. Some are made holy by embracing it, and others become resentful by refusing it. It makes some strong and crushes others.” *Mother M. Angelica*

Father Joseph Mary Wolfe wrote this commentary:

“I once heard a story about an egg, a carrot, and a coffee bean. When placed in boiling water, each responded differently. The egg got hard. The carrot got soft, but the coffee bean, ah, the blessed coffee bean, it changed the water! Adversity is the boiling water, which none of us can avoid (try as we might)! Whether it is universal, like a pandemic or war, or personal like illness or family strife, adversity is part of our journey and never leaves us the same.”

Let us pray for those, like the egg, whose hearts have become hardened through the trials of life: Lord, we ask that You free them from the dark prison of isolation, fear, and hopelessness so they may be receptive to Your love and a new beginning.

Let us pray for those, like the carrot, whose hearts are limp and discouraged: Father, renew their hope, strengthen their drooping hands, make straight paths for their feet, that what is lame may not be dislocated, but healed.

Let us give thanks for all the coffee beans among us: Loving God, You provide us with companions, guides for our journey who bring us light, good example, and friendship. Continue to pour out Your grace upon them, sustain their courage, strength, and creativity. Help us to be “coffee beans” in the midst of adversity, that our lives will be a testament to our Faith, as we proclaim: **“Jesus, I trust in You!”**
