POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO FAMILIES - "When a man and woman celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony, God, as it were, 'is mirrored' in them; He impresses in them His own Features and the indelible character of His love. Marriage is the icon of God's love for us. Indeed, God is communion too: the three Persons of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit live eternally in perfect unity. And this is precisely the mystery of matrimony: God makes of the two spouses one single life. The Bible uses a powerful expression and says 'one flesh,' so intimate is the union between man and woman in marriage. And this is precisely the mystery of marriage: the love of God which is reflected in the couple that decides to live together. Therefore, a man leaves his home, the home of his parents, and goes to life with his wife and unites himself so strongly to her that the two become – the Bible says – one flesh." *Pope Francis, General Audience, St. Peter's Square, April 2, 2014*

SAYINGS OF THE SAINTS - "In the first place, when you begin something good you must beg of the Lord with unflagging prayer to bring it to completion, so that He, who has already been so gracious as to count us among His sons, will never be saddened by our evil deeds. In fact, at all times He should be so served with the good things He has given us that not alone will He never be like an angry father who disinherits his children, nor yet as a dread lord, angered by our misdeeds, hand over to everlasting punishment the wretched servants who did not wish to follow him to glory." SUMMER CHURCH ATTIRE - When at church this summer please remember that we are in the house of God and our attire should reflect reverence. Out of respect for God and consideration for others, please dress appropriately for the celebration of Mass. Our attire should never be a distraction to others who are also gathering to praise and worship God.

NO VACATION FROM THE LORD - To praise God for the gift of each day, as well as all that we are and have, is part of our obligation given us in Baptism. During the summer months when the children are not in school and vacation time arrives, we are still expected to attend Mass and give God thanks and praise. It becomes a particular difficulty or an extra sacrifice when traveling or in a strange city to find the time of Mass, as well as location. When at camp or on vacation, please make every effort to find a Catholic church where you can attend Mass. What a beautiful family practice – traveling during the summertime on vacation and traveling with the Lord.

TRAVELER'S PRAYER - Loving Father, as we journey these next few days, keep us in Your loving care. Protect us from danger, from mechanical failure and from violent storms. Make us wise and prudent around water and in woods and mountains. Help us to be kind to each other and to enter into the relaxation of this trip with joyful hearts and may we return home more thankful, more generous and more mindful of our blessings.
