POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO FAMILIES

“In these days, as you reflect on the complementarity between man and woman, I urge you to emphasize yet another truth about marriage: that the permanent commitment to solidarity, fidelity, and fruitful love responds to the deepest longings of the human heart. Let us think especially of the young people who represent our future: it is important that they should not let the harmful mentality of the temporary affect them, but rather that they be revolutionaries with the courage to seek strong and lasting love; in other words, to go against the current: this must be done.” (*Humanum Colloquium, Rome, November 17, 2014*)

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION - This Solemnity commemorates the day when the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken directly into heaven after her life on earth had ended. Mary’s union with God in Christ was unique from the beginning. Her call to final union with God, body and soul, was also unique in the end. The Assumption asserts something about human existence in asserting something about Mary. That human existence is bodily existence and that the body is good because God created it. The Assumption goes beyond the mere material, however, and reminds us that we are destined for spiritual glory because we will one day be fully united with God through Christ.

Mass for the Holy Day, Saturday, August 15 will be celebrated in the church at 9am.

O holy Mary, my Mistress, into thy blessed trust and special keeping, into the bosom of thy tender mercy, this day, every day of my life and at the hour of my death, I commend my soul and body to thee I entrust all my hopes and consolations, all my trials and miseries, my life and the end of my life, that through thy most holy intercession and thy merits, all my actions may be ordered and disposed according to thy will and that of thy divine Son. *Amen.*
