About twice a month, we meet after the prayers to plan ways to spread the Pro-life message to others, including placing pamphlets in strategic places, occasional events, and participating in prayerful vigils. Seven Ways to Encourage Fortitude in Our Children (and Ourselves!)

1. Explore and study the lives of the Saints, who have remained strong in the face of seemingly insurmountable odds. Perhaps begin with the life of your Patron Saint?
2. Promote perseverance by encouraging your child to push through discouragement and discomfort. Keep trying!
3. Give your children detailed challenges, making them just difficult enough, but attainable. Set the bar high and celebrate baby steps.
4. Let your child fail and experience the natural consequences. We can't always protect our children from failure, but can help them learn deep lessons by examining those failures.
5. Create space and time for learning and dealing with difficult new skills, insisting on repeated practice. They will need your diligent direction to help them follow through.
6. Let them get bored and frustrated, resisting the urge to "fix everything" for them. Often, creativity and the ability to reframe a problem blossom from "boredom".
7. Help your child see the big picture, the result that may be far down the road and difficult to see at present. Give him a vision of what success will look like.
