## **POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO FAMILIES**

- "Marriage is...an everyday task, I could say a craftsman's task, a goldsmith's work, because the husband has the duty of making the wife more a woman and the wife has the duty of making the husband more of a man. Growing also in humanity, as man and woman. And this you do together. This is called growing together. This does not come out of thin air! The Lord blesses it, but it comes from your hands, from your attitudes, from your way of loving each other. To make us grow!

Always act so that the other may grow. Work at this. And thus, I don't know, I am thinking of you that one day you will walk along the streets of your town and the people will say, 'Look at that beautiful woman, so strong!...With the husband that she has, it's understandable!' And to you, too: 'Look at him and how he is!...With the wife he has, I can understand why.' It's this, reaching this point: Making one another grow together, one another.
