## POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO FAMILIES

“Thank you.’ It seems so easy to say these words, but we know that it is not. But it is important! We teach it to children, but then we ourselves forget it! Gratitude is an important sentiment...An old woman once said to me in Buenos Aires, ‘Gratitude is a flower that grows on a noble ground.’ Nobility of soul is necessary so that this flower might grow.

Do you remember the Gospel of Luke? Jesus heals ten lepers and then only one returns to say thank you to Jesus. The Lord says, ‘And the other nine, where are they?’ (Luke 17:11-19) This also holds true for us: do we know how to give thanks? In your relationship, and tomorrow in married life, it is important to keep alive the awareness that the other person is a gift from God – and for the gifts of God we say thank you, we must always give thanks for them. And in this interior attitude one says ‘thank you’ to the other for everything. It is not a kind word to use with strangers, to show you are polite. ### Respect Life Ministry

Each Tuesday, our Respect Life Ministry will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and other prayers at 3pm, in the Adoration Chapel. About twice a month, we meet after the prayers to plan ways to spread the Pro-life message to others, including placing pamphlets in strategic places, occasional events, and participating in prayerful vigils. Gain a Plenary Indulgence for departed loved ones any, and each day for the entire month of November 2020! A plenary indulgence – applicable only to the souls in Purgatory – is granted to the faithful who: devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed.

*Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace.”*

Here's what you need to do for an INDULGENCE: You must be in a state of grace (not have any unconfessed mortal sins on your soul), and these three conditions must accompany the act needed to gain the indulgence:

1-You must receive the Sacrament of Confession about 20 days before or after the indulgence is to be gained. 2-You must receive Holy Communion on that day on which you perform the indulgenced act. 3-You must recite prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (the prayers you choose to pray are up to you, but an “Our Father” and a “Hail Mary” are suggested). Finally, you must not have any attachment to sin, even venial sin.

### Veterans Day

Also known as Armistice Day, or Remembrance Day, is celebrated on November 11<sup>th</sup> each year. This is one holiday we do not transfer to Monday. Do you know why?

Veterans Day is celebrated at the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month since 1918 because that is the day and time that World War I officially ended. The armistice was signed and ceased the actual war, but the Treaty of Versailles was not formally signed until several months later.

While we have come to celebrate this day for all veterans, it was originally meant to celebrate the thousands who gave freely so that the world could be a more peaceful place after WWI.

The poem On Flanders Field written by John McCrae, speaks of the red poppies that grew in the fields where many soldiers from all over the world find their final resting place. We now wear paper poppies during many of our military/patriotic holidays (Veterans Day and Memorial Day) to celebrate those brave men and women.

It is traditional to wear the poppy on the left side – over your heart – as a symbol that those who fought and died for us are ever in our hearts – but that traditionally women wear their poppy on their right side, as they do all other jewelry.

The red represents the blood of all those who gave their lives; the black represents the mourning of those who didn't have their loved ones return home; and the green leaf represents the grass and crops growing, and future prosperity after the war destroyed so much.

The leaf should be positioned at 11 o'clock to represent the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month, the time that World War I formally ended. The British fall silent for two minutes on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month to remember their heroes. Please remember those brave men and women who protect and serve for all of us.
