POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO FAMILIES - "Let us learn to acknowledge our mistakes and to ask for forgiveness. In this way, too, a Christian family grows. We all know that the perfect family does not exist, nor a perfect husband or wife...we won't even speak about a perfect mother-in-law. We sinners exist. Jesus, who knows us well, teaches us a secret: don't let a day end without asking forgiveness, without peace returning to our home, to our family. It is normal for husband and wife to quarrel...Perhaps you were mad, perhaps plates flew, but please remember this: never let the sun go down without making peace! Never, never, never! This is a secret, a secret for maintaining love and making peace." (*Address to Engaged couples, St. Peter's Square, February 14, 2014*)

Gain a Plenary Indulgence for departed loved ones any day for the entire month of November 2020! A plenary indulgence – applicable only to the souls in Purgatory – is granted to the faithful who: devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed.

Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace."

Here's what you need to do for an INDULGENCE: You must be in a state of grace (not have any unconfessed mortal sins on your soul), and these three conditions must accompany the act needed to gain the indulgence:

1-You must receive the Sacrament of Confession about 20 days before or after the indulgence is to be gained. 2-You must receive Holy Communion on that day on which you perform the indulgenced act. 3-You must recite prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (the prayers you choose to pray are up to you, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested). Finally, you must not have any attachment to sin, even venial sin.

You are invited to enter the names of your deceased loved ones in our book located on the side altar under the statue of St. Joseph. Throughout the month of November these people will be especially remembered in all Masses offered at St. Patrick's.
