SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, which is the final Sunday of the Church's liturgical year. In the opening prayer of Mass we hear, "Almighty ever-living God, whose will is to restore all things in Your beloved Son, the King of the universe, grant, we pray, that the whole creation, set free from slavery, may render Your majesty service and ceaselessly proclaim Your praise." When Pope Pius XI established this feast in 1925 he was acting out of a long-standing belief in the power of the Church at prayer. At that time, many destructive forces were present in the world (including Adolph Hitler and Mussolini) that began many years of suffering and hardship for the peoples of Europe. Pope Pius XI knew that the language of prayer would be more powerful than his own exhortations, stating that acknowledging Christ's kingship would be the "most effective weapon against the destructive forces of the age." (Quas Primas, Dec. 11, 1925) The kingdom of Christ offers peace, truth, trust, forgiveness and love. Each of us is called to build up that kingdom by witnessing to Jesus in our day to day actions here on earth. May we give glory and praise to Christ our King and rejoice that we have been called to share His glory.

Gain a Plenary Indulgence for departed loved ones any day for the entire month of November 2020! A plenary indulgence – applicable only to the souls in Purgatory – is granted to the faithful who: devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed.

Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace."

Here's what you need to do for an INDULGENCE: You must be in a state of grace (not have any unconfessed mortal sins on your soul), and these three conditions must accompany the act needed to gain the indulgence:

- 1-You must receive the Sacrament of Confession about 20 days before or after the indulgence is to be gained.
 - 2-You must receive Holy Communion on that day on which you perform the indulgenced act.
 - 3-You must recite prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (the prayers you choose to pray are up to you, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested).
- Finally, you must not have any attachment to sin, even venial sin.
