THE SEASON OF ADVENT

Today we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent, and for the next four weeks our liturgies and our sanctuary will help us prepare for our Lord's coming at Christmas. Advent recalls the centuries of waiting when Jesus was foretold by Isaiah and all the prophets. The first two Sundays of Advent look forward to the second coming of Christ; the last two highlight His first coming to Bethlehem. The Church calls us into union with God during these special weeks of joyful anticipation that extends to Christmas. In Advent's spirit of joy, let us prepare our hearts and homes to greet our Lord and Redeemer.

THE ADVENT SANCTUARY

Our sanctuary is decorated to express our longing and expectation of our Lord's second coming. Violet or purple is the predominant color. Our vestments and sanctuary appointments reflect this longing for our Savior. The advent wreath represents the coming of the Messiah; the three purple candles symbolize our waiting and penitence as we await the Savior; the rose candle, our joy and hope that the Lord's power and presence is so near.

CONFESSIONS BEFORE CHRISTMAS

The season of Advent certainly lends itself to the Sacrament of Reconciliation as we approach the birth of Christ. **On the weekend of December 12 & 13, Father will hear confessions after all Masses.** Also the Diocesan wide "The Light is On For You" campaign, with confessions being heard in all churches will take place here at St Patrick's on **Monday, December 21st from 4-6pm in the Church.** We hope you and your families will all receive confession before Christmas.

CHRISTMAS FLOWERS

Gain a Plenary Indulgence for departed loved ones any day for the entire month of November 2020! A plenary indulgence – applicable only to the souls in Purgatory – is granted to the faithful who: devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed.

*Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord,
and let perpetual light shine upon
them. May they rest in peace."*

Here's what you need to do for an INDULGENCE: You must be in a state of grace (not have any unconfessed mortal sins on your soul), and these three conditions must accompany the act needed to gain the indulgence:
1-You must receive the Sacrament of Confession about 20 days before or after the indulgence is to be gained. 2-You must receive Holy Communion on that day on which you perform the indulgenced act. 3-You must recite prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (the prayers you choose to pray are up to you, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested). Finally, you must not have any attachment to sin, even venial sin.
