### **EASTER DUTY**

Among the precepts of the Church are the duties to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, during the Easter season (can. 920) and to confess grave sins at least once a year (can. 989). These precepts often go together because in order to receive Holy Communion, one must be in a "state of grace," that is free from grave sin (can. 916). Thus, they are called the "Easter duties." In the United States, the Easter duties may be fulfilled at any time between the First Sunday of Lent (1 March 2020) and Trinity Sunday (7 June 2020). When it is impossible for those who have not already done so to fulfill these duties, they are suspended.

### **THE EASTER SEASON**

This festive season of 50 days begins with the Easter Vigil and concludes with Pentecost. The content of the Easter celebration is not simply the Resurrection, but the reality of the Risen Lord living in His Church. This awareness of living faith is developed by encountering Jesus in His new life as the Risen Lord. The mysterious post-Resurrection appearances of Jesus are almost always centered around a meal. So we learn to understand the absence of Jesus as a new presence unlimited by time or space or His body. The Sacramental framework of this presence is the Eucharist. Our Eucharist's are our post-Resurrection encounters with Jesus. The Ascension contains the absence of Jesus in the Body, yet He is to return again to His humanity. The "little while" between the Ascension and the second coming has expanded into two thousand years, and we are challenged to understand how we fit into the new and full dimension of the Paschal Mystery. In the light of the Resurrection, we hear again the words of Jesus' farewell message on the night before He suffered. "Within a short time you will lose sight of Me, but soon after that you shall see Me again." These words explain our present experience of Jesus in the Eucharist. The final stage of the Easter celebration is Pentecost. The life-giving Spirit of Jesus triumphantly fills all things, all events all times. Filled with the same Spirit, we who are the Body of Christ are launched into a work that is not yet complete, in fact, it has barely begun.

### **MOTHERS DAY NOVENA**

Once again this year, we are offering a special novena of 9 Masses for all our mothers beginning on Mother's Day, May 9. The forms are in this week's bulletin and they include the dates that the Masses will be celebrated. Please fill out the form, writing clearly your mother's name or the name of the woman you wish to have remembered at the Masses, your name, and mark "living" or "deceased." Place the form in an envelope with your offering, marked "Mother's Day Novena" and drop it in the collection basket or at the parish office. If your mother is living you can stop at the office and pick up a beautiful Spiritual Bouquet card to present your mother on Mother's Day. All requests **MUST BE IN BY TUESDAY, MAY 4** so that the list of mothers and donors may be prepared for the Mother's Day bulletin.

### **DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY**

today is the Feast of Divine Mercy, as Jesus requested of St. Faustina and proclaimed by Pope St. John Paul II in 2000. In several entries in [her Diary](#), St. Faustina reported promises of grace and mercy associated with the Feast of Divine Mercy: "Ask of my faithful servant [a priest] that, on this day, he tell the whole world of My great mercy; that whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My Mercy." *Diary 300*

"I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day, the very depths of My tender Mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet". *Diary 699*

"I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession (within 8 days before or after) and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy". *Diary 1109*

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is prayed at 3pm each day, and especially on this Feast. **Therefore, our Adoration Chapel will be open today (Sunday), beginning at 2:30pm, for anyone to join in praying the Chaplet and venerating the Image of Divine Mercy.**

## DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET

How to recite the Chaplet (On regular Rosary beads):

1. Hail Mary
2. Our Father
3. Apostles' Creed
4. On each Our Father bead:  
*Eternal Father, we offer You the Body and Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and the sins of the whole world.*
5. On the ten Hail Mary beads:  
*For the sake of His sowerful Passion, have mercy on us, and on the whole world.*
6. Repeat for all five decades.
7. Closing prayers: *Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.*

*Eternal God, in Whom Mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your Mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your Holy Will, which is Love and Mercy Itself.
