## SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST

On the day of Pentecost when the even weeks of Easter have come to an end, Christ's Passover is fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, manifested, given and communicated as a divine person; of His fullness, Christ, the Lord, pours out the Spirit in abundance. On that day, the Holy Trinity is fully revealed. Since that day, the Kingdom announced by Christ has been open to those who believe in Him...by His coming, which never ceases...the time of the Church, the Kingdom, already inherited though not yet consummated. "God is love: and love is His first gift containing all others...Because we are dead, or at least wounded through sin, the first effect of the gift of love is forgiveness of our sins. The communion of the Holy Spirit in the Church restores to the baptized the divine likeness lost through sin. He gives us the "pledge" or "first fruits" of our inheritance: the very life of the Holy Trinity, which is to love as "God has loved us." This love is the source of the new life in Christ, made possible because we have received "power" from the Holy Spirit. By this power of the Spirit, God's children can bear much fruit..."we live by the Spirit;" the more we renounce ourselves, the more we "walk by the Spirit." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church, (731-736).*)
