**POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO FAMILIES** - "It is important to ask yourself if it is possible to love each other "forever." This is a question that must be asked: is it possible to love "forever?" Today so many people are afraid of making definitive decisions. One boy said to his bishop, "I want to become a priest, but only for ten years." He was afraid of a definitive choice. But that is a general fear that comes from our culture. To make life decisions seems impossible. Today everything changes so quickly; nothing lasts long. And this mentality leads many who are preparing for marriage to say, "We are together as long as the love lasts," and then? All the best and see you later...and so ends the marriage.

But what do we mean by "love?" Is it only a feeling, a psychological state? Certainly, if that is it, then we cannot build on anything solid. But if, instead, love is a relationship, then it is a reality that grows, and we can also say by way of example that it is built up like a home. And a home is built together, not alone! To build something here means to foster and aid growth."
