HOPE APPEAL 2021 - is now underway here at St. Patrick's. The Hope Appeal helps fund agencies and programs that provide for so many people in need. Thanks to your generosity we made our assessment for 2020. **We received 100% of that coverage, \$3,288.83, which was placed into our Restoration Fund.** This year's assessment is \$20,775.03, and I am pleased to report to date that St. Patrick's has raised **\$16,260 from 54 donors toward our assessment – that's about 75% of our goal!** Please prayerfully consider increasing your gift by \$25 this year. Many of you have received a letter and pledge form directly to your home, we ask all other parishioners to please take a pledge form from the church pews and send it back to the Parish Office as soon as possible, so we can make our assessment for this year. POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO FAMILIES - "Can I, may I?" This is the polite request to enter the life on another with respect and care. One should learn how to ask: "May I do this?" "Would you like for us to do this?" "Should we take up this initiative, to educate our children in the way?" "Do you want to go out tonight?" In short, to ask permission means to know how to enter with courtesy into the lives of others...

It's not easy, not easy at all. Sometimes, however, manners are used in a heavy way, like hiking boots! True love does not impose itself harshly and aggressively. In the Fioretti (Little Flowers) of St. Francis, we find this expression: "For know, dear brother, that courtesy is one of the attributes of God ...for courtesy is the sister of charity, it extinguishes hatred and kindles love" (chapter 37). Yes courtesy kindles love. And today in our families, in our world, which is frequently violent and arrogant, there is so much need for courtesy. And this can begin at home." (*Address to Engaged Couples, St. Peter's Square, February 14, 2014*)

OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH - "God's love individual, real, unchanging – is the true source of our worth, identity, and dignity. It really is not a question of who we are, but rather, whose we are. Because His love will never change, nothing can reduce our God-given dignity, and nothing can diminish the immeasurable worth of our lives." (*USCCB Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities*)

SAYINGS OF THE SAINTS - "For love is the virtue which unifies. Love is the virtue which makes its own the sufferings of the good Jesus who is the object of this love. This fire which penetrates the inner core of one's being changes the lover into his beloved. And on a higher level where love is merged with sorrow and sorrow mingled with love, there results a certain blend of love and sorrow that is so complete that the love can no longer be distinguished from the sorrow, nor the sorrow from the love. In this way the soul which loves finds its joy in its sorrow and its exultation in its sorrowing love." (*St. Paul of the Cross, whose Feast Day is October 19*)

THE WISDOM OF FULTON SHEEN - "Sensationalists miss divinity for just that reason: the true religion is always unspectacular. The foolish virgins go to buy oil for their lamps, and when they came back, they find the Bridegroom already returned. And the door closed. It was so undramatic. A beautiful maiden knocks at the door of an inn, and an innkeeper tells her there is no room. Into a stable she enters, and there a child is born. It was God's entrance into the world. It was so undramatic."
