HOPE APPEAL 2021 - is now underway here at St. Patrick's. The Hope Appeal helps fund agencies and programs that provide for so many people in need. POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO FAMILIES

"Thank you." It seems so easy to say these words, but we know that it is not. But it is important! We teach it to children, but then we ourselves forget it! Gratitude is an important sentiment...An old woman once said to me in Buenos Aires, 'Gratitude is a flower that grows on a noble ground.' Nobility of soul is necessary to that this flower might grow.

Do you remember the Gospel of Luke? Jesus heals ten lepers and then only one returns to say thank you to Jesus. The Lord says, 'And the other nine, where are they?' (Luke 17:11-19) This also holds true for us: do we know how to give thanks? In your relationship, and tomorrow in married life, it is important to keep alive the awareness that the other person is a gift from God – and for the gifts of God we say thank you, we must always give thanks for them. And in this interior attitude one says 'thank you' to the other for everything. It is not a kind word to use with strangers, to show you are polite.
