THE WISDOM OF FULTON SHEEN
“In every friendship hearts grow and entwine themselves together so that the hearts seem to make only one heart with only a common thought. That is why separation is so painful; it is not so much two hearts separating, but one being torn asunder.”

SAYINGS OF THE SAINTS - “Shall I tell you how to go from strength to strength? You have managed, let us say, to be attentive for once in choir: how are you going to be more attentive next time and make your service more pleasing to God? I will tell you. The tiniest fire of divine love has been in you, has it? Then do not rush to make a parade of it. Do not take it out into the icy blast. Keep the furnace door shut on it so that it does not die out. In other words, fly from avoidable distractions, keep your mind fixed on God, keep away from idle gossip.” *(St. Charles Borromeo, whose feast day is November 4)*
