THANKSGIVING MASS

The people of St. Patrick's are invited to give thanks and praise to God in a special Liturgy of Thanksgiving on Thursday, November 25 at 9am in the Church. Please plan to be with us this day in gratitude for all God has blessed us with during the past year. We ask everyone to bring a gift of canned or boxed goods, or paper products to the Altar at the presentation of gifts as a sign of our concern for our neighbor. We hope you can be with us on Thanksgiving Day.

Sharing bread at the Thanksgiving Liturgy has been a tradition here for many years. You are asked to bring a wrapped and labeled small loaf of bread to Mass and place it in the boxes near the Altar. Father will bless the bread and it will be given out following Communion. At our family meal, we will pray for the family-person that made the bread. The prayer card that should be filled out and attached can be found at the entrances of the church.

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

We ask You for Your blessings, dear Lord, on this day of Thanksgiving, for our family, our friends, and this bounty of which we are to partake.

We give You thanks for Your love, which we give back to You, and which we share with each other.

We beseech You, dear Lord, to bless those who do not love, who are naked, who are hungry, and who are alone. Please enfold them in Your most compassionate heart, which is love and mercy.

We ask all of these things, dear Lord, in the name of Jesus Christ, our Victim-High Priest, who is King and Savior, and the giver of all gifts. *Amen.*
