GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

World Day of Prayer will be observed on Sunday, May 8, 2022 also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." The purpose of this day is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). Please pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, diaconate, religious life, societies of apostolic life or secular institutes. Let us pray for young men and women; That God may give them the gift of understanding to discern their service in the Church, the priesthood, diaconate, or consecrated life; And for the gift of courage to follow His call.

THE SANCTUARY

The word comes from the Latin Sanctuarium, a “holy place,” a shrine. It is the area in Catholic churches where the Altar, Ambo (pulpit) and the Celebrant’s chair, the server’s chairs are found and often times the Tabernacle and Sanctuary Lamp. The sanctuary is adorned with statues, and a large crucifix and sometimes side altars. In the sanctuary, priests, deacons, and bishops lead the church community in prayer and divine worship. It is here the Word of God; the Sacred Scripture is proclaimed by the Lector and ordained clergy and its explanation and application in the Homily is delivered. Traditionally, the sanctuary was divided from the nave of the church by being elevated in some way and sometimes by a railing.

EASTER DUTY

Among the precepts of the Church are the duties to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, during the Easter season (can. 920) and to confess grave sins at least once a year (can. 989). These precepts often go together because in order to receive Holy Communion, one must be in a “state of grace,” that is free from grave sin (can. 916). Thus, they are called the “Easter duties.” In the United States, the Easter duties may be fulfilled at any time between the First Sunday of Lent (March 6, 2022) and Trinity Sunday (June 12, 2022). When it is impossible for those who have not already done so to fulfill these duties, they are suspended.
