FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

If your father is living, you can stop in at the Sacristy after Mass or at the office and pick up a beautiful Spiritual Bouquet card to present to your father for Father's Day. All requests MUST BE IN BY TUESDAY, JUNE 14. Thank you.

EASTER DUTY

Among the precepts of the Church are the duties to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, during the Easter season (can. 920) and to confess grave sins at least once a year (can. 989). These precepts often go together because in order to receive Holy Communion, one must be in a "state of grace," that is free from grave sin (can. 916). Thus, they are called the "Easter duties." In the United States, the Easter duties may be fulfilled at any time between the First Sunday of Lent (March 6, 2022) and Trinity Sunday (June 12, 2022). When it is impossible for those who have not already done so to fulfill these duties, they are suspended.
