FATHER'S DAY

The tradition of celebrating Father's Day began in 1910 by Mrs. John Bruce Dodd of Spokane, Washington. The custom spread throughout the country to such an extent that, in 1939, a national Father's Day committee was formed. The idea of the movement was recognition of the parent who serves at the head and guiding force of every family.

Many areas of human endeavor and history have given the title of Father to the forming and guiding man. This is a title that is given by custom to the one who gains an unusual position or succeeds in a difficult endeavor, such as George Washington, the Father of our Country, or Abraham, the Father of the faithful people of God. The title Father was most lovingly and gratefully applied by Christ to our Creator when addressed in the special prayer he gave us.

The most profound aspect of the title, Father, can be seen in man's sharing in the Fatherhood of God. This is the great gift of giving life and then furthering it through limitless care and kindness. A father is thus seen as the potent mover and preserver of life, equally relating pleasure and responsibility, which fosters a fruitful family life.

A FATHER'S TEN PRECEPTS

1. He makes himself responsible for his children's behavior.
2. He is never blinded by love to his child's best interest by recognizing and correcting weakness.
3. He makes his child feel secure.
4. He shares in his child's activities.
5. He has his child's complete confidence.
6. He is always available to help solve youthful problems.
7. He doesn't demand filial devotion – he wins it.
8. He recognizes and accepts as largely his responsibility his child's mental and spiritual growth.
9. He contributes to making the home the child's haven.
10. He strives to be honest with his children.

125th CELEBRATION NEWS

The committees have been working hard preparing for our 125th Anniversary Celebration on **Sunday, July 17th**. Bishop Lucia will be here to celebrate our Mass at 10:00am. SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI

Jesus once changed water into wine by a word of command at Cana in Galilee. Should we not believe that He changes wine into Blood? For in the symbol of bread it is His Body that is given to you, and in the symbol of wine it is His Blood so that by receiving the Body and Blood of Christ you may become one body and one blood with Him. Thus, we become Christ-bearers, since His Body and His Blood are spread throughout our limbs. So do not think of Them as mere bread and wine; as our Lord said, they are Body and Blood. And if the senses suggest otherwise, let faith confirm you. Do not judge on the basis of taste, but on the basis of faith be assured beyond all doubts that you have been allowed to receive the Body and Blood of Christ. (*St. Cyril of Jerusalem*)

SOLEMNITY OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

On the Friday following the Feast of Corpus Christi is the devotional Feast of the Sacred Heart. The theme of this day honors Jesus for the love symbolized by His heart. Devotion to the Sacred Heart became popular with mystics in the 13th and 14th centuries. The tradition became widespread as a result of a series of visions of the Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, in 1673 – 1675. Almost 200 years later, in 1856, a special feast was mandated for the universal Church. In 1899, Pope Leo XII ordered that the world be consecrated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Pope Pius XI elevated the feast to the same rank as Christmas.

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

For **9 weeks, which began on Mothers' Day**, our whole parish is **spiritually adopting pre-born children**, using the prayer on the back of the bulletin. Of course, you can continue to pray for your adopted baby for the full nine months of his or her time in the womb! **A Baby Shower will take place next week and the following week. Donations can be placed in the boxes at the entrances and will be given to pregnancy help centers in the area.**

He is receiving antibodies from his mother, which provide immunity to a wide variety of diseases after birth. Your baby has grown to about 15 inches!
