MISSIONARY APPEAL THIS WEEKEND

Each year the Office of Propagation of the Faith sponsors the Mission Cooperative Plan. This weekend, our parish will host Fr. Stephen Ogaro from the Catholic Diocese of Nakuru. In his Diocese in Kenya, Africa there have been many challenges brought by a severe drought. Their 2022 priority is to address the food situation and reconstruct ruined livelihoods. They hope to dig shallow wells to supply safe and clean water and install sanitation systems in schools and public areas to prevent infections. They need medicine and health education to the poor and malnourished and relief food to support up to 500 school children. Please be as generous as possible to this special second collection.
