125th CELEBRATION NEXT WEEKEND

Dear brothers and sisters,
It is with a profound sense of gratitude to Almighty God that we gather next weekend to celebrate 125 years of a Catholic presence at St. Patrick's in Jordan. Bishop Douglas Lucia will be here to celebrate and preach at the 10:00 Mass and will join us for the luncheon that follows at the community center. Actually, it is our 164th year since in 1858 the first church was dedicated on Hamilton Street, where our cemetery is, as a mission of St. Joseph's in Camillus. We were incorporated by Bishop Patrick Ludden on May 11, 1896, no longer a mission, and we are using that date in this 125th celebration. Our present church was dedicated on August 24, 1952 under the pastorate of Rev. James Murray at the cost of \$85,000.00. Since then many priests have served the parish including Fr. John Quigley, Fr. James Nicholson, Msgr. Francis Culkin, Fr. John Roark, Fr. Carl Pilla, Msgr. Philip Meaney, Fr. John Phelan and myself. All of them have been blessed to serve the faithful people of St. Patrick's. May our celebration give glory to God with our gratitude and a sense of accomplishment for all of God's blessings.
