## POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO FAMILIES

“ ‘Can I, may I?’ This is the polite request to enter the life of another with respect and care. One should learn how to ask: ‘May I do this?’ ‘Would you like for us to do this?’ ‘Should we take up this initiative, to educate our children in this way?’ ‘Do you want to go out tonight?’ In short, to ask permission means to know how to enter with courtesy into the lives of others...

It’s not easy, not easy at all. Sometimes, however, manners are used in a heavy way, like hiking boots! True love does not impose itself harshly and aggressively. In the Fioretti (Little Flowers) of St. Francis, we find this expression: ‘For know, dear brother, that courtesy is one of the attributes of God ...for courtesy is the sister of charity, it extinguishes hatred and kindles love’ (chapter 37). Yes, courtesy kindles love. And today in our families, in our world, which is frequently violent and arrogant, there is so much need for courtesy. And this can begin at home.” (Address to Engaged Couples, St. Peter’s Square, February 14, 2014)

## SAYINGS OF THE SAINTS

“For love is the virtue which unifies. Love is the virtue which makes its own the sufferings of the good Jesus who is the object of this love. This fire which penetrates the inner core of one’s being changes the lover into his beloved. And on a higher level where love is merged with sorrow and sorrow mingled with love, there results a certain blend of love and sorrow that is so complete that the love can no longer be distinguished from the sorrow, nor the sorrow from the love. In this way the soul which loves finds its joy in its sorrow and its exultation in its sorrowing love.” (St. Paul of the Cross)

Together, when we pledge our gift to the Annual HOPE Appeal, we are giving thanks to Christ for the innumerable gifts we’ve been given and helping our friends and neighbors who benefit each year from the diocesan good works funded through our annual appeal.
