ARCHDIOCESE FOR THE MILITARY SERVICES

The AMS is the only source of income for Catholic chaplains for the US military and VA medical centers. The AMS serves 1.8 million Catholics worldwide with only 500 ordained priests. The AMS receives no funding from the U.S. government or U.S. Military in support to provide pastoral care and services to our military personnel. The AMS has no parishes to take up collections. The AMS depends entirely on generous donors like you for survival. In November 2012 the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops approved a triennial National collection for the AMS, first taken in 2013 and again in 2016 and 2019.

This weekend we will join the Catholics of the U.S. in taking up a special second collection for the AMS to help provide the sacraments and pastoral care to our military.
